How Does the Synod Work That we are witnessing a new moment is underlined by the way the participants are seated inside the Paul V1 audience hall and by the very different process that is being followed by this synod. Never before has a synod of Bishops in the Vatican seen cardinals, bishops, laymen and women together at round tables to discuss, listen and discern the Church's future. In the past, the plenary sessions took place in a theatre – style hall with the presiding figures facing members of the audience arranged in rows, according to their place in the hierarchy. Last week it was striking to see Pope Francis address fellow participants from one of the round tables and not from a stage, as popes would have done in the past. Even if nothing else changes, the new process that has been adopted – which includes priests and lay people, including women, as well as bishops as voting members – represents a significant shift. While in the past certain questions would simply be taken off the agenda, at this Synod all the hot – button issues are on the table. Austen Ivereigh, one of the expert theologians inside the hall, told me the 'big shift' is that most of the work in the synod is being done in small groups using the method of 'conversation in the spirit'. He explained that this is not primarily a debate but a space in which the participants listen and respond to the points made. Everyone can speak within their small groups and to the assembly and is free to make written submissions to the synod secretariat. Technology also plays its part; each participant has an electronic tablet and uses it to request to speak. In another shift, the primary language being used inside the hall is English rather than Italian. 'The object of this whole exercise is synodality itself', Ivereigh said. 'It's a new way of proceeding, of operating, of thinking within the Church, which centres on communion, participation, and mission, that is, the involvement of people in processes of discernment prior to decision – taking in the Church. Although Francis has strengthened the synod's authority, it remains a consultative body, and the Pope has the final say. The October 2023 synod will produce a document synthesising the discussions. Ivereigh predicts that a series of commissions will be established to study proposals before the second Vatican synod assembly in October 2024.

PATHWAYS TO THE FUTURE

In 1959, Pope Saint John XXIII called for an ecumenical council with the purpose of bringing the Church "up to date". The Council, Vatican II, concluded its work in 1965 having produced 16 documents, one of which was on the role and participation of the laity in the life of the Church. It said "As sharers in the role of Christ the Priest, the Prophet, and the King, the laity have an active part to play in the life and activity of the Church" and that "as far as possible, the laity ought to collaborate energetically in every apostolic and missionary undertaking sponsored by their local parish". It continues "For it is a duty and honour for Christians to return to God a part of the good things they receive from Him." (Decree on the Laity, Chapter III, section 10)




There is a strong resonance in these statements with our Gospel passage today, where Jesus challenges us to give back "to God what belongs to God". Through our baptism, we are citizens of God's Kingdom and we have been given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to serve our King and our fellow citizens. This is Mission Sunday, when we are called to give financial and spiritual support to our brothers and sisters overseas who share our faith, and to missionaries who spread the Good News and provide life-giving support to those in need. Our missionary duty is not, however, limited to one Sunday in the Church's year and to the work of others in distant lands only. Our missionary role continues day by day in our parishes and communities using the gifts that God has given us and that His spirit sustains in our service to others and working with our clergy.

We find ourselves again at a moment of bringing the Church "up to date". As we plan for the renewal of our Church in Down and Connor through Pathways to the Future, and as the Church worldwide journeys together in the Synod, let us ask ourselves what part we play in the life and activity of the Church. Today's Gospel challenges us to consider how we are paying our dues to our King in our daily lives and within our communities of faith. May the Holy Spirit guide and encourage us, and may God arm us "that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from Me, all is nothing" (Isaiah 45:6)
