

In what for the apostles was a very bad storm, Jesus slept. It's like he seems asleep in the deep darknesses of life

- people's darkness of self-esteem,
- long-term illness,
- an addiction,
- migration,

Things that causes big storms in our lives.

It gives us the courage and strength to deal with what are storms in our lives.

Remember a bad time when God seemed to help you. Be grateful.
