Jesus grew up like all of us in a family - coming from the family of heaven to that of Mary and Joseph and their extended family. We know his grandparents' names; he had cousins, and he didn't get on with them all; he had an aunt as the wife of Clopas.

We salute today families who survive and support each other in difficult times: parents bringing up their children in a one-parent family; grandparents making sacrifices for another generation; people widowed and living now without their loved ones; adoptive and foster parents. We thank our parents and families for sacrifices made to bring us up.

Jesus, guide us in life; Mary, look after us; Joseph, pray for us.
