God of the Second Chance: Consider The fig tree

This seems a rather strange story about Galileans being killed by **P**ilate. They were no greater sinners than others, but people thought they were being punished by **G**od. **J**esus asks us to repent but does not punish



the sinner. Repent is the word of Lent - and followed by the invitation to believe the good news of the gospel.

During Holy Week these pieces of cloth will be sown together to make the Garment of Suffering which will be placed before the Cross on Good Friday as an expression of our desire to share in Jesus' suffering so that we may find healing and share in his Resurrection and new life even now.
